MYER CREEK DEVELOPMENT AND FUNDING SOURCES

In 1961, the City of Calhoun acquired 110 acres just outside of Calhoun on Hwy 136 and in 1987 McLean County Fiscal Court acquired an additional 78 acres for a landfill.

In 1992 the idea was formulated to use the property for a land demonstration and in 1994, Judge Executive Larry Whitaker along with the support of the McLean County 4-H Council presented the idea to Fiscal Court and Myer Creek Park was born.

Within the next four years, 4-H develops an outdoor arena and concession stand and begins hosting events on site, and a forest stewardship is developed by the KY Department of Forestry

Scope of Work: The funds were used to build two shelters at Myer

Creek Park.

Oct. 1, 2001 \$5,000 Recreational Trails Program (Dept for Local

Government)

\$7,000 (*Local Match*)

Total Expenditure = \$12,461.81 (Labor, Equipment,

Culverts, Bedrock)

Scope of Services: This project initially aimed at constructing 5 miles

(6 ft wide) of new trail. However, the final

document from RTP said the funding was to be expended towards constructing a 3,200 ft (6 ft wide) trail for "walking, jogging, and biking that is accessible for horse and four wheeler riding".

Scope of Services: Maintenance of existing 6 ft wide 5 mile long

multi-use natural surface trail.

Scope of Services: To construct a 60' x 104' Multi-purpose building at

a cost of \$58,640 which included design. The structure was later renamed the 4-H Activity Center. Construction began in the Fall of 2004.

Final cost for the structure was \$58,640 which included

design costs.

Fall of 2005 \$15,000 Kentucky Agriculture Development Funds

\$15,000 match from McLean County 4-H Council

and private donations.

Scope of Work: Construction of a 40 x 100 demonstration area

and portable stalls adjacent to the McLean County 4-H Activities Center. Construction

began in the Spring of 2006.

Final cost for facility was \$20,952 plus the costs for

the portable stalls and site work.

June 28, 2006 \$250,000 (Governor's Office for Local Development) for

Master Planning & Development of Myer Creek Park Agricultural Complex enacted under House

Bill 380 by the 2006 General Assembly.

Scope of Services: Funds to be used for Myer Creek Project including

but not limited to cost of Master Plan completion, engineering and architectural services (design) costs, permitting and legal fees, contingencies, construction costs fro complex facilities, feasibility

study costs and administration fees.

Scope of Work: To be used for lights, public address system and

perimeter fencing in the 4-H Activities Center

area.

June 21, 2007 \$105,000.00 (Governor's Office of Local Development)

enacted under HB 380 by the 2006 General Assembly authorizing the "Parameters for County

Flexibility" program.

Scope of Services: The majority of the funds were designated for

Park Improvements in the communities of Island, Livermore, Calhoun, Sacramento and Beech Grove with a small portion of the funds to be used to purchase additional property at Myer

Creek Park.

\$25,000 of the \$105,000 was spent to purchase an

additional 28 acres at Myer Creek Park. The remainder of the funds was distributed to each of

the communities listed above for park
