

Dating back to the 1860's is this house once owned by a Lieut. Colonel in the Confederat army and one of the writers of the Kentucky Constitution.



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
Built in 1854 by the Griffith heirs, this house was used as Union headquarters and hospital by Grig. Gen. Thomas I. Crittenden during the Civil War. It is otherwise known as the History House and is on the National Register of Historic Places.

KERRICK-MUSTER HOUSE

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This house was built around 1890 by the original owner, Jim Kerrick, who made and fired his brick near the river bank.




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JOHN CALHOUN'S MONUMENT

Built in 1904-08, this courthouse is the third for McLean County. Its classical design features an inset Ionic portico.




ARRISON-WILHITE HOUSE

This home and the Muster Funeral Home were originally owned by the Harrison family. Built before the turn of the century, the Wilhite House contains most original architectural features.

CHURCH





Organized in 1850-51, this church has seen three sanctuaries, the second of which is pictured here. Built in 1907 and used until 1990, the structure still stands.



TICHENOR HOUSE

This house was built before 1898 and appeared in the book <u>Green River Country</u>. The exterior of the house has been preserved as it appeared at that time.






This home and a small one room building at the back were built before 1871. The small building was later used as a school.

1895 when it was organized and built on a parcel of land valued at \$350. The structure appears much as it did when it was built.

CALHOUN CHRISTIAN CHURCH



Organized during the Civil War, this is the third structure to house the Methodist Church in Calhoun. Built in 1890, this structure has been remodeled several times.

Built around 1867, this house was once the site of Calhoon College and the Masonic Lodge.
